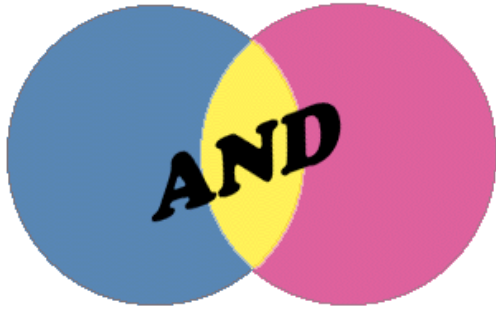


Boolean Operators

Use Boolean Operators (+, OR, -) to find exactly what you're looking for on the web!

Note: In the Venn diagrams below, the results found by the search are yellow.

Use AND (the + symbol) to narrow a search. The search engine will only show results that have BOTH terms you requested.

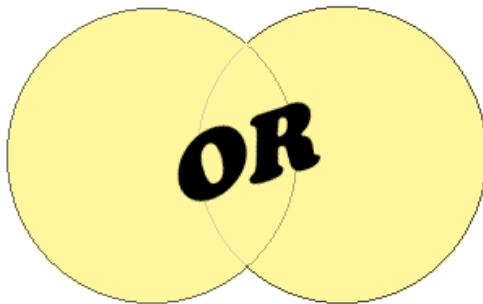


Use the + symbol before all keywords.
Do not put a space between + and the word.

Example: +dogs +pictures

Use OR (a blank space) to expand a search. The search engine will show results with EITHER of the terms you requested.

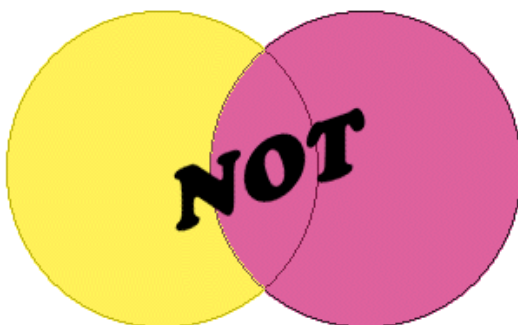
Note: OR is used most often to combine similar terms.



Use a blank space before all keywords.

Example: dogs puppies

Use NOT (the - symbol) to exclude a term. The search engine will only show results with the first term you requested. All sites with the second term will be eliminated.



Use the - symbol before all keywords you DO NOT want. Do not put a space between - and the word.

Example: dogs -collies
